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Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a lovely and lively start to our new term and everyone has managed to get back into the routines of getting up early and ready for school. We have begun this term with a high focus on keeping safe both in school and outside of school. I have been in meetings and discussions this week regarding the many concerns raised by families about the danger to them from cars parking inappropriately. Surrey County Council and Surrey Police are keen to support our efforts to eradicate anti-social parking and will be working closely with us over the next few months to help us do so.

Our children were excited about a new venture we are undertaking in order to promote sustainable travel to and from school using The Living Streets initiative WOW (Walk Once a Week). We have registered Cranmere Primary school as taking part and children can earn a monthly badge for walking or cycling at least once a week to and from school. There are badges to be awarded every month and they do become quite collectable. I hope that every child will be able to participate and earn their badge even if they are driven to school as parking in The Drive and surrounding roads makes for a much calmer parking scenario and a more pleasant walk into school using our Blair Avenue entrance. I have also been in discussions with our Road Safety team about improving the pathway into school from Blair Avenue. Further news on this will be in future newsletters.
